Papua New Guinea - volcano 'Mount Ulawun'

Wednesday morning 26 June 2019 local time the volcano 'Mount Ulawun' in Papua New Guinea erupted. This volcano is located in the province West New Britain on the island New Britain, not far from Hargy Oil Palms Ltd (HOPL), a 100% subsidiary of SIPEF.

As a precaution, resulting from this eruption, the most northern plantations and one of the three palm oil extraction mills of HOPL, together with the surrounding villages, were evacuated.

No casualties, nor serious infrastructure damages were reported.

SIPEF does not expect any material negative financial impact from the eruption. Nevertheless, the activities could be hampered temporarily by the heavy ashfall which occurred on Wednesday.

According to the latest reports of the local volcanic observatory, the eruption would have decreased in strength already on Wednesday evening. The management monitors the situation closely.
